abandoned along roads

Over 10,000 vehicles auctioned; proceeds shared with police

SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT CHENNAL

The Chennai Corporation has removed 10,954 vehicles abandoned by residents on city roads. The civic body has auctioned the cars and motorcycles for ₹3.05 crore and shared 75% of the proceeds with the city police to install CCTV cameras along roads.

Corporation officials on Monday handed over the money to the city police to improve safety and security of residents in various neighbourhoods.

Health hazard

Former Corporation floor leader V. Sukumar Babu said the abandoned vehicles were posing a public health hazard to the residents in vaneighbourhoods. "Some owners have been reluctant to remove the abandoned cars and motorcy-We have found cles. mosquitoes breeding inside them and carcasses of stray dogs. Garbage piles up near the vehicles have increased public health risk. Road relaying is also affected because of the presence of such vehicles," he said.

Former councillors have been reiterating the need for removing the abandoned vehicles before relaying the

Clean-up drive

- In the first phase of the drive. the Corporation removed 7,875 vehicles
- The civic body auctioned these vehicles for **₹2.14 crore**, sharing **75%** of the money with the police
- In the second phase, the civic body removed 3,079 vehicles in the past few days
- The auction fetched ₹91.11 lakh; ₹68.33 lakh was shared with the police
- More than 25,000 vehicles have reportedly been abandoned along 33,000 interior roads and 471 bus route roads



33,000 interior roads and 471 bus routes in the city.

'Not informed'

However, many residents alleged that the vehicles were removed by the Corporation without issuing any notice to owners. For example, Ice House residents alleged that Corporation workers removed autorickshaws and other vehicles damaged during the police action to control riots on the Marina beach and the neighbouring residential areas following the Jallikkattu protests.

"The vehicle was reportedly set on fire by some unidentified persons. I have to answer the bank that gave loan for the vehicle. I did not get compensation for the loss either," said a resident.

After removing 7,875 vehicles in the first phase, the Corporation has cleared 3,079 vehicles in the past few days.

However, many of the spares of the abandoned vehicles were allegedly taken away by the workers who removed the vehicles. As a result, the residents alleged that the civic body has not been able to auction the entire material collected along the roads.

Suspect escapes from police station

A suspect escaped from the custody of police in North Beach police station under the pretext of attending to nature's call.

The suspect, Arul, 32, was caught by the public for sexually harassing a minor and her mother, who were sleeping on the platform in Mannady on Sunday night.

After one of them raised an alarm, he was nabbed and handed over to police.

Arul was detained at the North Beach police station and handcuffed.

At 4 a.m., he asked police personnel to unlock the handcuffs as he wanted to attend to nature's call. Police personnel allowed him. However, he escaped after scaling the wall. Police have launched a search for him.
